The five meter tall twisting geometry of the Living Tree is constructed using sustainably sourced thinnings from a local woodland and is co-designed with Charley Brentnall of Xylotek, Alexandre Mballa-Ekobena, Momentum Engineers and realised by Carpenter Oak with support from Shedworks.

The native plants and natural elements in the Living Tree Forest were generously provided by Andrew Grant of Grant Associates and Piers Taylor of Invisible Studio.

In addition, Roxana Vilk, the Vilk Collective and Squidsoup have designed a Circle/وری of Magical Musical Lights, alongside 'I Am An Insect' an immersive 3D soundscape composed by Gabriel Ware, produced by Martyn Ware for Illustrious Co. Ltd.

Listening Flowers have been designed by Matthew Leece and Jono Burgess as part of the Travelling Forest 21 at the American Museum June-September 2021, transformed into the FUNgal network of the
